To meet the university's General Education and Liberal Studies (GELS) requirements, students must complete each of the 10 goal areas of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC) and complete 48 unduplicated credits. Eight (8) of the 48 credits must be upper division (300-level or higher) to fulfill the university's Liberal Studies requirement. Each course title is followed by a number in parenthesis (4). This number indicates the number of credits for that course. Course titles followed by more than one number, such as (2-4), indicate a variable-credit course.

Superscript Number:

- Superscript number (¹⁰) indicates that a course meets more than one goal area requirement. For example, NSCI 204¹⁰ listed under Goal 3 meets Goals 3 and 10. Although the credits count only once, the course satisfies the two goal area requirements.

- Separated by a forward slash (7/8) indicates that a course will meet one or the other goal area but not both.
