Courses for First-Year Students, 100 and 200 level

First year students, those with fewer than 30 credits, are advised to focus on General Education courses their first few terms. Students cannot register for most upper division courses, courses numbered 300 or higher, until they have earned 30 credits. Students who have less than 16 credits are required to take <u>Metro 101: Your Academic Journey</u>.
