#### **APPLICATION PROCEDURE**

The Law Enforcement Licensing Certificate Program (herein "program") took on a new look starting fall semester 2017 as part of a broader redesign of the law enforcement curriculum for both degree seeking and certificate students. The program is geared toward individuals with a baccalaureate degree in any discipline from a <u>regionally accredited</u> college or university who intend to complete the licensing requirements of the Minnesota Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training. Only individuals who will have <u>completed</u> a baccalaureate (four-year) degree prior to June 2019 should apply to the program.

Those interested in becoming a licensed peace officer in Minnesota should also be aware of the minimum selection standards established by the Minnesota Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training. The Minimum Selection Standards for Peace Officer Licensure Advisory Form is included for your review and signature as part of the application materials.

There are two prerequisite courses for this program: Introduction to Criminal Justice and Juvenile Justice. Applicants must provide verification of current enrollment or completion of both courses with a grade of C- or better as part of their application. Metropolitan State University offers these courses online during the summer for individuals accepted into the program who have not yet completed these requirements.

The program cost for 2019-2020 is <u>estimated</u> to be approximately \$9,700. This includes tuition and fees for the theory, lab and skills practicum courses. Not included in this estimate are the costs associated with the prerequisite courses, emergency medical responder certification, textbooks, physical and psychological exams, uniforms and equipment (skills practicum), etc.

This program is offered in a cohort format in which accepted students will start together as a group fall semester and normally finish together the following summer semester. The curriculum includes the same professional peace officer education courses required for degree seeking students majoring in law enforcement. This overlap allows more options and flexibility while reducing the probability of the certificate program being cancelled due to low enrollment.

The required courses are normally offered sequentially on Saturdays during fall and spring semesters. If a Saturday course does not meet minimum enrollment, it will likely be offered as part of the traditional academic schedule in which each of the required courses are generally held once a week in the evening (Monday–Thursday). Under certain circumstances, students will be allowed to take one or more of the required courses on the traditional academic schedule if approved by the Program Advisor.

Students in the certificate program have traditionally defaulted to the skills practicum held evenings during the week and all-day Saturday, but can petition to be in the skills practicum held on weekdays. This practice will likely be continued for this cohort group, but is subject to change.

#### **APPLICATION DEADLINE**

Applications are now being accepted for the 2019-2020 Law Enforcement Licensing Certificate Program. Completed applications to the program will be accepted until Friday, April 19, 2019. Applications received after this time will be considered based on available space and may be put on a wait list. Please note this program is subject to cancellation or modification if minimum enrollment numbers are not reached and/or there are other significant factors.

#### **COMPLETING THE APPLICATION PACKET**

More applications from qualified individuals may be received than there are spaces available. Qualified students who are not admitted will be placed on a waiting list. Applications are evaluated based on the following information:

- 1) Complete application packet
- 2) Cover letter (see details below)
- 3) Personal resume (see details below)
- 4) Grade point average as documented in an official transcript
- 5) Eligibility to be licensed as a peace officer in Minnesota (see details below)
- 6) Complete Admission Preference Certification Form (if sponsored by an agency)

Review the instructions below carefully and submit applications only when all materials are complete. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

- 1) Application Checklist: Fill this form out completely.
- 2) Application Cover Sheet: Fill this form out completely.
- **3) Cover Letter:** Submit a cover letter outlining your career objectives. Explain why you want to become a Minnesota peace officer and why you are interested in this particular program. This letter provides an opportunity for applicants to demonstrate strong written communication skills.
- 4) Transcript/Verification of Bachelor's Degree: Applicants must obtain an <u>official transcript</u> from the academic institution that awarded the baccalaureate degree and submit it in the original sealed envelope. Transcripts <u>must</u> be sent directly to Director Bryan Litsey at the School of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice by the academic institution or they may be enclosed with the application materials. Applicants who will be graduating in the spring need

Verification of bachelor's degree must be received before official acceptance to the program will be granted. **Graduates of Metropolitan State University do not need to send an official transcript.** 

- 5) Personal Resume: Resumes should be clear and easy to understand. Be certain to include experiences that are relevant to the peace officer profession, such as employment or volunteer work. These experiences should demonstrate your ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds and highlight your community commitment. Your resume should include the following information:
  - career objectives
  - education
  - community involvement
  - work experience (past and/or current)
  - any additional law enforcement/criminal justice experience
  - special talent or skills (for example, language, EMT/paramedic training, computer)
- 6) Peace Officer Minimum Selection Standards: Read the form carefully and indicate in the appropriate check box whether or not you meet the minimum selection standards for licensure as a peace officer in Minnesota. Once doing so, sign and date the form. Any questions concerning the minimum selection standards should be directed to Director Bryan Litsey at <a href="mailto:bryan.litsey@metrostate.edu">bryan.litsey@metrostate.edu</a> or (763) 657-3752.
- 7) Admission Preference Certification: This form is to be used only by those who have received a contingent offer of employment from a law enforcement agency. The chief law enforcement officer of the agency (i.e., chief of police, county sheriff, etc.) must sign the form. Application evaluators may contact the chief law enforcement officer directly to verify that the contingent offer of employment is bona fide. Current employment by a law enforcement agency does not constitute a bona fide offer of employment.
- **8) Submitting Application:** Send completed application materials directly to the program coordinator before the deadline.

All completed application materials must be received in the School of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice no later than 4:00 PM, FRIDAY, APRIL 19, 2019. Applications from qualified individuals received after this deadline will be considered on a space available basis and/or wait list admission.

#### **NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION TO PROGRAM**

The School of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice will notify applicants of provisional admission in April 2019. Upon receipt of an admission offer to the program, students will be required to:

- 1) sign a letter of acceptance to reserve a seat in the program,
- 2) be formally admitted to Metropolitan State University. Instructions will be provided to those individuals admitted to the program.

#### PHYSICAL CONDITIONING

Physical conditioning is an important aspect of law enforcement. Therefore, applicants are encouraged to begin and/or continue an exercise program to address physical conditioning. Key components of physical fitness are flexibility, cardiopulmonary endurance, muscular strength and muscular endurance.

#### PROGRAM COORDINATOR AND ACADEMIC ADVISOR

**Bryan Litsey** is currently both the Director and Academic Advisor for the Law Enforcement Licensing Certificate Program. He first came to Metropolitan State University in December 2014 after retiring as a police officer in Minnesota with nearly 37 years of service. The final 16 of those years he served as Chief of Police and Emergency Management Director for a suburban law enforcement agency in the Twin Cities area.

Courses are normally offered sequentially on Saturdays during fall and spring semesters. If a Saturday course does not meet minimum enrollment, it will likely still be offered as part of the traditional academic schedule in which each of the required courses are generally held once a week in the evening (Monday–Thursday). The skills practicums are normally offered summer semester. Students in the certificate program have traditionally defaulted to the skills practicum held evenings during the week and all-day Saturday, but can petition to be in the skills practicum held on weekdays. This practice will likely be continued for this cohort group, but is subject to change.

#### **Other Considerations**

#### **Emergency Medical Responder Training/Certification**

Emergency Medical Responder (First Responder) certification or higher is not required to graduate from this program. However, it is needed prior to receiving sign-off to take the Minnesota peace officer licensing exam. This certification must be through the Emergency Medical Services Regulatory Board (EMSRB). Students need to submit a copy of their EMSRB card (does not have to be current) to the P.O.S.T. Coordinator at Metropolitan State University before requesting sign-off to take the Minnesota peace officer licensing exam.

### PEACE OFFICER LICENSURE ADVISORY: MINIMUM SELECTION STANDARDS

Minnesota Rules, Chapter 6700.0300, subp. 5(D), requires all students be advised in writing of the minimum selection standards to become a licensed peace officer in Minnesota. Students are advised of these standards in order to help them make informed decisions about participation in the professional peace officer education program.

#### Minn, R. 6700.0700 MINIMUM SELECTION STANDARDS

Subpart 1. **Selection standards.** A person eligible to be licensed shall meet the following minimum selection standards before being appointed to the position of peace officer. The appointing authority may affirm that the applicant has already completed certain of these standards, but the affirmation must be documented pursuant to subpart 2.

- A. The applicant shall be a citizen of the United States.
- B. The applicant shall possess a valid Minnesota driver's license; or in case of residency therein, a valid driver's license from another state; or eligibility to obtain either license.
- C. The applicant shall complete a comprehensive written application.
- D. The applicant shall submit to a thorough background search, including searches by local, state, and federal agencies, to disclose the existence of any criminal record or conduct which would adversely affect the performance by the applicant of peace officer duties.
- E. The applicant must not be required to register as a predatory offender under MN STAT, section <u>243.166</u> or 243.167.
- F. No applicant may be appointed to the position of peace officer who has been convicted:
  - (1) of a felony in this state or in any other state or federal jurisdiction;
  - (2) of any offense in any other state or federal jurisdiction which would have been a felony if committed in Minnesota:
  - (3) under MN STAT, section <u>609.224</u>, <u>609.2242</u>, <u>609.231</u>, <u>609.2325</u>, <u>609.233</u>, <u>609.2335</u>, <u>609.2335</u>, <u>609.234</u>, <u>609.324</u>, <u>609.465</u>, <u>609.466</u>, <u>609.52</u>, or <u>609.72</u>, <u>sub. 3</u>; or convicted under any state or federal narcotics or controlled substance law irrespective of any proceeding under MN STAT, section <u>152.18</u>, or any similar law of another state or federal law; or
  - (4) of any of the crimes listed in this item in another state or federal jurisdiction, or under a local ordinance that would be a conviction if committed in Minnesota.
- G. The applicant shall be fingerprinted for the purpose of disclosure of any felony convictions. Fingerprint cards shall be forwarded to the appropriate divisions of the Bureau of Criminal Apprehension and the Federal Bureau of Investigation. The chief law enforcement officer shall immediately notify the board if a previous felony conviction is discovered.
- H. A licensed physician or surgeon shall make a thorough medical examination of the applicant to determine that the applicant is free from any physical condition which might adversely affect the performance of peace officer duties.
- I. An evaluation, including an oral interview, shall be made by a licensed psychologist to determine that the applicant is free from any emotional or mental condition which might adversely affect the performance of peace officer duties.
- J. The applicant shall pass a job-related examination of the applicant's physical strength and agility to demonstrate the possession of physical skills necessary to the accomplishment of the duties and functions of a peace officer.
- K. The applicant shall successfully complete an oral examination conducted by or for the agency to demonstrate the possession of communication skills necessary to the accomplishment of the duties and functions of a peace officer.
- Subp. 2. **Documentation.** The chief law enforcement officer shall maintain documentation necessary to show completion of subpart 1. The chief law enforcement officer is not required to obtain documentation for subpart 1, item J, if the applicant completed part 6700.0500, subpart 3. The documentation is subject to periodic review by the board, and shall be made available to the board at its request. Subp. 3. [Repealed, 18 SR 1961]
- Subp. 4. **More rigid standards.** An appointing authority may require an applicant to meet more rigid standards than those prescribed in this part.

#### Additional Information:

- 1) According to MN RULES 6700.0100, Subp.9a., if an individual has been convicted of a felony in Minnesota or any other state or federal jurisdiction, the individual <u>is barred</u> from becoming a peace officer in Minnesota. Even if the individual has had a felony conviction expunged or continued for dismissal, the individual is still barred from peace officer licensure.
- 2) If an individual has been convicted of any of the following Minnesota Statutes, the individual <u>is barred</u> from becoming a peace officer in Minnesota. Even if the individual has had the conviction expunged or continued for dismissal the individual is still barred from peace officer licensure.

- 3) If an individual has been convicted under <u>any</u> narcotics or controlled substance law the individual <u>is barred</u> from becoming a peace officer in Minnesota. This includes possession of a small amount of marijuana or possession of drug paraphernalia, <u>unless</u> the conviction was a petty misdemeanor.
- 4) A juvenile record does not bar an individual from becoming a peace officer in Minnesota unless the individual is required to register as a predatory offender. If required to register as a predatory offender as a juvenile an individual is barred from becoming an officer until the registration requirement is lifted.
