

The Commencement ceremony will be held on Saturday, May 8, 2021.

What is Commencement?

Commencement is a formal event, held twice annually (spring and fall), to celebrate and recognize the milestone of completing (or the anticipated completion of) a program or degree for a respective group of students. Participation in commencement is optional and does not confirm completion of degree requirements. Commencement activities (Graduation & Commencement Expo, President's Outstanding Student Awards, and Commencement) are facilitated by Student Life & Leadership Development.

Graduation is the official confirmation of the completion of all degree requirements, as maintained on your degree audit report, and is recorded on your official transcript, both of which are administered by the Registrar's Office.

Virtual Ceremony Information

The virtual commencement ceremony is a pre-recorded ceremony that is viewed via Stage Clip on Saturday, May 8, 2021. There are no live components of the ceremony to ensure the safety of all Metropolitan State University community members. While we wish we could celebrate with all commencement participants and their guests in person, we take the current COVID-19 pandemic seriously and hope to be able to celebrate again with you all in the future.

Process

Commencement participants will be enrolled in the Commencement D2L workshop at metrostate.learn.minnstate.edu by completing the Commencement Participation Quiz in the GRAD WKSP, Summer Grad Qualtrics Survey, or by e-mailing student.life@metrostate.edu to request to participate in commencement no later than 2/15/2021. Once enrolled in the Commencement D2L workshop, students will be able to access continued virtual commencement updates online. Students must regularly review the workshop and their university e-mails for the most up-to-date commencement information.

Important: By the end of March, students will receive an email from our vendors, Marching Order and Stage Clip, to submit a photo, quote, and video. These materials must be submitted by the deadline. Since the virtual ceremony is pre-recorded, we cannot accept any materials or commencement participation requests past the deadline.

- If commencement participants do not receive these e-mails, please e-mail student.life@metrostate.edu as soon as possible and before the deadline.
 - This is the only way we can ensure that all of your materials are included in the virtual ceremony.

What do I submit?

You will submit a photo and quote to Marching Order for your Virtual Commencement presentation slide.

You can submit an optional congratulatory video to Stage Clip, which will be viewed after your slide in the Virtual Commencement Ceremony.

How to wear your regalia:

Tassels should be worn as follows:

- Doctoral and Masters graduates: Left shoulder side
- Undergraduate graduates: Right shoulder side

Stoles should be worn over your gown. You may wear as many stoles as you would like.

Caps can be decorated, so long as they are not offensive or distracting.

Graduate and doctoral program hoods should not be worn until a student is hooded on stage.

Conferring of degrees

The University President confers degrees at the end of the ceremony. Graduates are expected to stay until the end of the ceremony.

Frequently asked questions/Additional guest information

- Tickets: Tickets are not needed or required for the virtual commencement ceremony.
 Please feel free to share the link with your family members, guests, or loved ones. SLLD will e-mail you the ceremony link the week of the ceremony.
- **Ceremony link**: SLLD will share the ceremony link with you the week of virtual commencement. Make sure you check D2L and your e-mail. If you cannot find the information, you can access the link the day of the ceremony at the Metro State Website.



- Are there any aspects of the ceremony that are "live?" For all participants' safety during the COVID-19 pandemic, all aspects of the Virtual Commencement are prerecorded and virtual, so you may view via the livestream in the safety of your home. We encourage you to share the link with your loved ones and set up "watch parties" via Zoom or other online software to celebrate together!
- Virtual commencement submission information: For the virtual ceremony, commencement participants will receive an email from Marching Order and Stage Clip to submit a photo, quote, and video. You must submit these materials by the deadline.
 Since the virtual ceremony is pre-recorded, we cannot accept any materials past the deadline.
