How to Format a Basic Thesis Statement

Three parts

- 1. An Observation, Question or Problem
- 2. A Claim, Answer or Solution
- 3. Some Evidence: reasons & facts

An *observation, question or problem* leads to a *claim, answer or solution* which is explained through *evidence: reasons and facts.*

Three patterns

1. If this is true, then that must be true because of this.

If this *observation, question, problem,* is like this, then this *claim, answer, solution* must be true because of this *evidence.*

2. This should be understood this way because of that.

The *observation, question, problem* is something like this *claim, answer, solution* because of this *evidence.*

3. This should be done this way because of that.

This *observation, question, problem* should be done this *claim, answer, solution* way because of that *evidence.*
