Fall 2021 Evidence Based Practices in Corrections Certificate Program

APPLICATION PROCEDURE

The Evidence Based Practices in Corrections Certificate Program (herein "EBP Program") began when faculty from the School of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice (SLC) and the Department of Human

Services worked with Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation (DOCCR) to create and pilot a program designed to teach people the knowledge and skills they need to be successful in working with justice involved individuals. Representatives from both agencies met continuously over several years. This development team identified that students would benefit from being taught the history of evidence-based practices in corrections, Motivational Interviewing, cognitive behavioral interventions, case planning, risk assessment tools and how they are guided by the principles of effective intervention. The program was successfully piloted in Fall 2017. Student feedback on the pilot was overwhelming positive, and most pilot students have moved into new jobs in the field of corrections.

Students participating in the EBP Program enroll in four courses (for a total of 12 credits) concurrently: Introduction to Evidence-Based Practices (CJS 202), Counseling and Interviewing Skills (HSER 346; which includes Motivational Interviewing and Cognitive Behavioral Interventions), Risk Need Responsivity in Evidence-Based Practices (CJS 303), and Case Planning with Justice-Involved Individuals (CJS 304). These courses also fulfill the required directed electives for a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Metropolitan State University. This program is offered in a cohort format in which accepted students will take all required courses together at the same time. Fall 2021 will be the fourth cohort to complete the EBP Program while earning college credit at Metropolitan State University.

The curriculum includes the same education that probation officers in the state of Minnesota receive while on the job. This means students who receive an EBP Certificate from Metropolitan State University will be entering the job market with the skills they need to be competitive and have the necessary skills to make an immediate impact with clients. But this does not come easy; the EBP Program is very rigorous. Classes are held two evenings per week for 3.25 hours each and approximately one Saturday per month for a full 8 hours. Due to the practical skills that are taught, regular attendance is mandatory. Failure to attend at least 90% of course hours will result in a failing grade for the course. Students who fail any of the courses in the EBP Program are not eligible to receive the EBP Certificate. And due to the cohort nature of the EBP Program, individual courses cannot be made up. Just like a job, the EBP Program requires commitment! All courses in 2021 will taught virtually via Zoom.

The program cost for Fall 2021 is <u>estimated</u> to be approximately \$3850. This includes tuition and fees for the courses, LS/CMI training materials and simulation fee. Not included in this estimate are the costs for textbooks. The EBP Certificate Program is not currently eligible for federal financial aid. There are scholarships available (see attached application) and the program does qualify for tuition reimbursement in Hennepin County and many other counties who offer this benefit.

APPLICATION DEADLINE

Applications are now being accepted for the Fall 2021 Evidence-Based Practices in Corrections

Certificate Program. Completed applications to the program will be accepted until Friday, April 9, 2021.

Applications received after this time will be considered based on available space and may be put on a wait list. Please note this program is subject to cancellation or modification if minimum enrollment numbers are not reached and/or there are other significant factors.

COMPLETING THE APPLICATION PACKET

More applications from qualified individuals may be received than there are spaces available. Qualified students who are not admitted will be placed on a waiting list. Applications are evaluated based on the following information:

- 1) Complete application packet
- 2) Cover letter (see details below)
- 3) Personal resume (see details below)

Review the instructions below carefully and submit applications only when all materials are complete. Incomplete applications will not be considered.

- 1) Application Checklist: Fill this form out completely.
- 2) Application Cover Sheet: Fill this form out completely.
- 3) Cover Letter: Submit a cover letter outlining your career objectives. Explain why you want to participate in the EBP in Corrections Certificate Program at Metropolitan State University. This letter provides an opportunity for applicants to demonstrate strong written communication skills.
- **4) Current Resume:** Resumes should be clear and easy to understand. Be certain to include experiences that are relevant to working with justice-involved individuals, such as employment or volunteer work. These experiences should demonstrate your ability to work with people from diverse backgrounds. Your resume should include the following information:
 - career objectives
 - education
 - community involvement
 - work experience (past and/or current)
 - any additional experience working with justice-involved individuals
- **5) Submitting Application:** Send completed application materials directly to the program coordinator before the deadline via email.

NOTIFICATION OF ADMISSION TO PROGRAM

The School of Law Enforcement and Criminal Justice will notify applicants of provisional admission in April 2021. Upon receipt of an admission offer to the program, students will be required to:

- 1) sign a letter of acceptance to reserve a seat in the program,
- 2) be formally admitted to Metropolitan State University. Instructions will be provided to those individuals admitted to the program.

PROGRAM COORDINATOR

Lesli Blair, PhD is currently both the coordinator of the Evidence-Based Practices in Corrections Certificate Program and an associate professor in the Criminal Justice Bachelor of Arts program at Metropolitan State University. She graduated from the doctoral program in the School of Criminal Justice at the University of Cincinnati. As a graduate student, she immediately began working under Dr. Edward Latessa at the University of Cincinnati Corrections Institute (UCCI). Dr. Blair continues to work for UCCI as a contractor, coaching probation officers in the use of Effective Practices in Correctional Supervision (EPICS). She is passionate about encouraging the use of evidence-based practices in the field of corrections.

ACTING COORDINATOR 2020-2021

Jennifer Schaefer Loer, MSW is the acting coordinator while Dr. Blair is on sabbatical. Ms. Schaefer Loer has 28 years of experience working with justice involved individuals. She currently works as the Evidence Based Practice Coordinator for Hennepin County Department of Community Corrections and Rehabilitation and is also community faculty at Metropolitan State University as an instructor in the EBP Certificate Program for the past four years.
